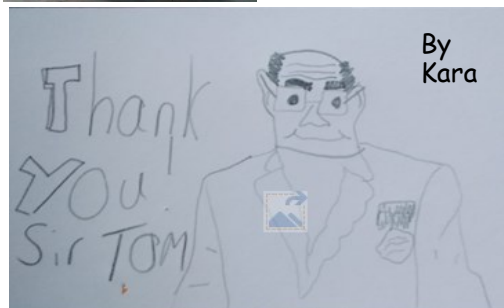

We are very sad to let you all know that Father Neville Ashton has passed away.

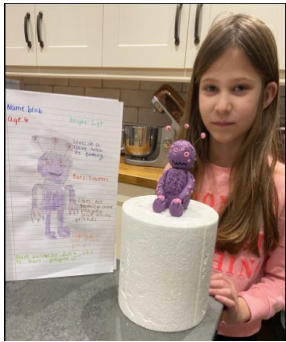

100-word challenge from Year 6

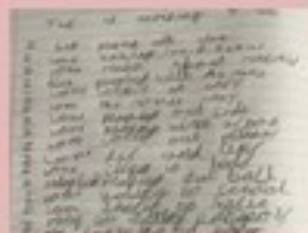
Sir Captain Tom, what a man,

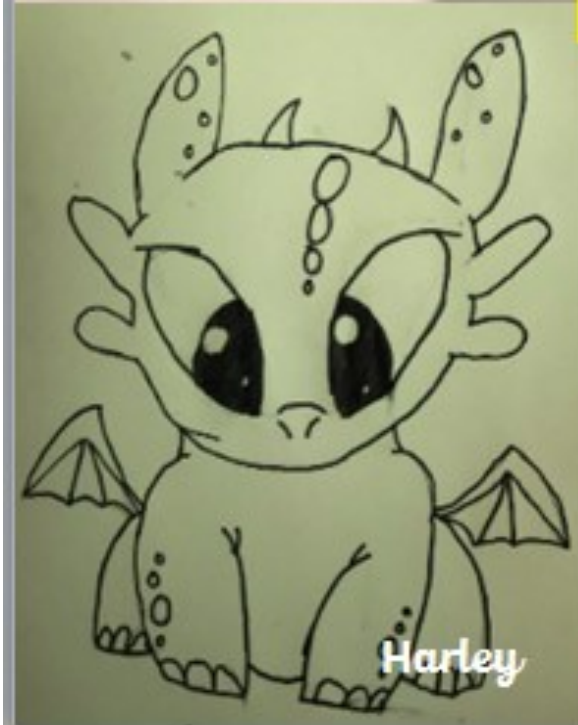
